MARK A. GRABER is a Professor of Government and Politics at the University of Maryland, College Park. He has an undergraduate degree from Dartmouth College (1978), a J.D. from Columbia Law School (1981) and a PhD. from Yale University. Professor Graber is the author of *TRANSFORMING FREE SPEECH* (California 1991) and *RETHINKING ABORTION* (Princeton 1996), as well as numerous articles on constitutional law, politics, and development. His works have won the Edward Corwin, the Congressional Quarterly, McGraw-Hill, and Hughes Goessart prizes for scholarly excellence. He is presently finishing a study of antebellum constitutional politics, *DRED SCOTT AND THE PROBLEM OF CONSTITUTIONAL EVIL*, as well as an edited collection on *MARBURY V. MADISON*.
