Graber is a Professor of Government and Politics at the University of Maryland, College Park. He has an undergraduate degree from Dartmouth College (1978), a J.D. from Columbia Law School (1981) and a PhD. from Yale University. Professor Graber is the author of TRANSFORMING FREE SPEECH (California 1991) and RETHINKING ABORTION (Princeton 1996), as well as numerous articles on constitutional law, politics, and development.
