CRAIG BYRON HOLMAN, Ph.D., is currently Senior Policy Analyst with the Brennan Center for Justice at New York University. Previously, he served as Project Director, National Resource Center (NRC), a private research institution associated with the Center for Governmental Studies in Los Angeles. Holman was also Executive Director of the Californians for Political Reform (CPR) Foundation, a nonprofit public interest organization committed to the defense and implementation of campaign finance laws in California.



As Senior Policy Analyst at the Brennan Center, Dr. Holman has assisted in drafting campaign finance reform legislation at the state and local levels, developed campaign finance regulations at the federal and state levels, and has conducted numerous research projects on the impact of money in politics. Presently, Holman is overseeing a joint study with the University of Wisconsin monitoring and analyzing television campaign commercials in the 2000 election cycle. He has been called upon to assist as a researcher and/or expert witness defending in court the campaign finance reform laws of Alaska, Arkansas, California and Colorado. He has authored and co-authored several studies on campaign finance reform and the initiative process, including three books entitled *THE PRICE OF JUSTICE: A CASE STUDY IN JUDICIAL CAMPAIGN FINANCING* (1995); *TO GOVERN OURSELVES: BALLOT INITIATIVES IN THE LOS ANGELES AREA* (1992), and *DEMOCRACY BY INITIATIVE* (1992).
